Gasoline . . . Hard to Find, Expensive . . .

Gasoline is not only expensive and hard to get, it also is explosive, Kenneth Klingler, manager of the Rochester Safety Council, warned last week.

The council warns all that it is extremely dangerous to store gasoline in garages or automobiles in an effort to balance the fuel shortage.

"No motorist or homeowner would willingly place a bomb in their car or home," Klingler said. "Yet gasoline can be considered a liquid bomb.

"A can of gasoline in the trunk or passenger compartment of a car could turn a minor traffic mishap into a fiery highway holocaust within seconds of impact.

"Similarly, the homeowner who uses gasoline for any domestic purpose faces a potential risk. Even with the best equipment, careful maintenance and proper handling, gasoline still presents a hazard in the house."

The council also cautioned drivers on longer trips not to take an extra supply along to avoid running out of fuel. It told drivers to plan their travel routes and keep the tank at least a quarter full (or an amount miles of driving to avoid the need for carrying extra gasoline.

Pope Tells Workers Church Their Friend

Pomezia, Italy (RNS) - In his first formal meeting with the world of Italian labor, Pope John Paul II told some 10,000 blue collar workers of this depress, industrial town south of Rome that they should view the Church as a friendly, not an antagonistic, force.


Tension between the Church and left-wing forces such as the Socialist and Communist parties, which traditionally represent the working classes in Italy, is an old fact of Italian political life.

"I have had a personal experience with physical work like yours, of daily fatigue, dependence and monotony, the pope said, referring to his factory experience in Poland during World War II.
"Therefore, consider me your friend and colleague."

The pope, who holds two doctoral degrees, drew applause and laughter when he said. "Four years of hard manual labor are worth more than two doctorates."
