## Gears Up . . . . . 9

After a successful Stewardship effort last year, St. Patrick's Parish in Owego has decided to continue the program, and is gearing up for another campaign this year. Parish staff and volunteers think the program is so worth the effort it takes to mount that Stewardship will become an annual event for years to come.

A Rochester group called Women against Violence against Women are planning to join a march through the Times Square area of New York City. The area is infamous for its pervasiveness of pornography and illicit sexual activity.

## Slight Decline . . . . . 17

An enrollment decline of only 23 pupils was revealed when the Chemung County General Education Board schools opened this month, the CCGEB found out at its regular meeting on Sept. 13. Martin Tracy, who has been the Finance Committee chairman, was elected president of the body. Preparations for the annual Walkathon and for Catholic Schools Week also was discussed.

In a homily eulogizing his predecessor the pontiff described Pope Paul as "a man of profound, difficult and unshakable faith."

"Paul VI," said the Polish-born pontiff, "taught the whole Church the meaning of faith in line with the times."

"What else if not the teaching of faith linked to works was the meaning of his great encyclicals, in particular

'Populorum Progressio,' and in another dimension, 'Humanae Vitae?'

The encyclical renouncing all forms of artificial birth control, including the pill, was published in 1968.

Referring to it, Pope John Paul said: "Perhaps it is understood now better than a decade ago. Coherence between faith and life must emerge from every work. It must show itself in every field of our behavior."

More than 20,000 persons attended the memorial Mass.

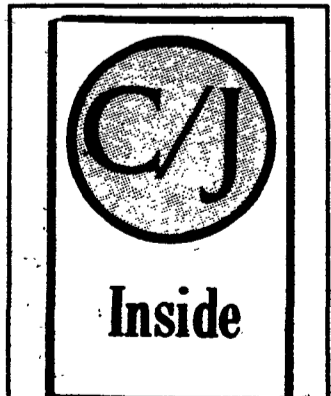

# Gannett

Mass requests have been fulfilled.

— All deposits for housing units the shrine planned to build, but later scrapped in the face of financial disaster, have been repaid.

— All previously outstanding bills have been paid. The bishop said all accounts since 1975 have been kept current.

— The perpetual care fund of the Pauline-owned Westminster Cemetery in Bala Cynwyd, Pa., has been replenished and lapsed obligations have been met.

— All local banks which had advanced funds to the shrine have been repaid.

— Repayment of individual loans made to the shrine; \$790 remains outstanding because the lenders could not be located.

— All Shrine Memorial requests for commemorative plaques have been fulfilled instead with bronze memorials "since the financial situation does not permit further construction at this time."

— The repayment of \$1,506,000 to coupon note holders who had loaned money to the shrine at 5½ and 7½ per cent interest rates between 1965 and 1969.

Other long-term recommendations which neither the bishop nor his spokesman would discuss are still being evaluated, the bishop's statement said.

Meanwhile in San Francisco, Archbishop John R. Quinn who will accompany the pontiff on his United States tour, said that he doubts that the Pope would respond to the Gannett charges. "It's already been dealt with," he said. "It's an old story — five years old. It's a most interesting

phenomenon that a news item that is five years old is suddenly brought out at a time when the Pope is visiting the United States. They have a way of describing those kinds of things in Communist countries."

But the Gannett series also

accused the Church of a cover-up which repressed further investigation. Gannett also claimed that Pope John Paul II "abruptly closed the probe of the order and its bizarre exploits in America with a final, formal papal decree on May 21 of this year."

Bishop Guilfoyle responded to the charge, saying, "It is untrue to speak of a cover-up . . . Problems existed before the visitation began but during its nearly five years every recommendation of the visitators relating to the administration of the shrine has been carried out."

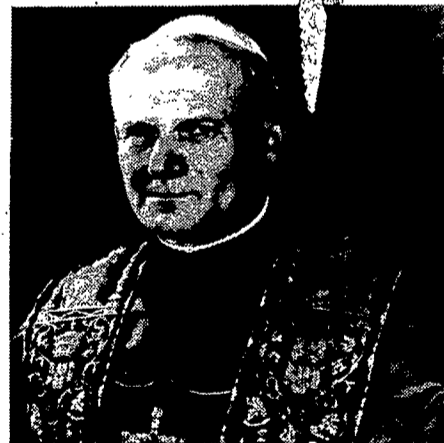
