

The shrill complaints against the Pope by women who demand to be made priestesses, and who consider themselves anguished victims of "an unjust, chauvinistice Catholic Church" are mostly made by aggressive celibate Sisters, and a few uncelibate women who are not. religious. I think these

women do not represent the majority of good Catholic women, including many devoted Sisters, who are faithful to the guidance of the Church. While claiming no prophetic vision, my guess is that in a few years, frustrated in their demands, these women will leave the religious life which they are presently using as a springboard organization, propaganda, divisiveness, and undermining their communities. And that some will leave the Church to be ordained as ministers in some sympathetic denominations. We have had some such sad examples from priests who were once greatly in the headlines. While it is a pity, the Church will be better off. Our Lord warned: "If a household is divided against itself, that house will never stand." (Mc. 3:25)
