Seminar Centers On Energy

Mrs. Mary Nickles, who teaches chemistry, mathematics, and science and society, at Our Lady of Mercy, participated in a week-long workshop on energy at Eisenhower College, Aug. 20-25. She was one of forty secondary school teachers who attended the seminar.

Participants heard lectures from resident and guest faculty, developed laboratory procedures and models, and traveled from the college on field trips related to energy issues. Teachers in the workshop had the opportunity to develop energy exercises for their own classrooms.

Sponsored by a grant from the U.S. Department of Energy, the workshop provided teachers of science and social science with practical energy information to incorporate into their lessons in the classroom.
