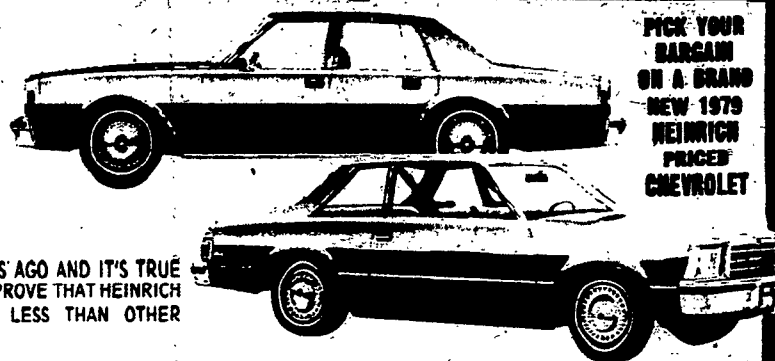
#### FIRE PREVENTION
