## New Drug System Adopted

Hornell — The "unit dose" system, a method for accurate measurement and distribution of medication, is being implemented at St. James Mercy

Hospital, Paul Shephard, associate administrator, has announced.

The system used special carts to accommodate a single-unit packaging of medications. Each cart is equipped with two 16-drawer sections. A drawer for each patient holds a 24-hour supply

on paper work for the staff and allow the pharmacies to check the compatibility of prescribed drugs which we were not able to do as well previously."

Nurses have commented that they like the accuracy of the system, and, with the time saved, have more time for direct patient care.

Irfan Mehr, chief pharmacist, explained that "the initial cost of the system will be absorbed by savings accrued because unit dose will cost less to operate than the system we have been using. The new system will cut down

Mehr also noted that drug waste will be minimized, since it will no longer be necessary to dispose of the unused portion of a multiple dose supply. In many cases that will constitute a saving for the patient.
