Mrs. Katherine Hoctor of Saranac Lake died Oct. 22, 1979, in a Plattsburgh hospital. She was 89 years old.

She was the widow of Cornelius Hoctor and an aunt of Father Thomas D. Hoctor, chaplain at Rochester Psychiatric Center, and of Sister Marion Hoctor, academic dean of Nazareth College.

Mrs. Hoctor, a native of Lyon Mountain, had lived at Saranac Lake for 80 years. She was a charter member and a life member of the Catholic Daughters of the Americas, Court St. Bernard.
