Pope John Paul II is back at the Vatican and has appointed members to a special commission on church unity between the Eastern Orthodox Church and Rome. The pontiff's intent on his journey to Turkey was to strengthen the moves to unity begun by his predecessor Pope Paul VI and late Patriarch Athanagoras. The two churches split in 1054.

O'Meara Named Archbishop

New York(RNS)—Edward T. O'Meara, auxiliary bishop of St. Louis and director of the National Society for the Propagation of the Faith, has been named the new archbishop of Indianapolis.

The papal appointment was announced last week in Washington by Archbishop Jean Jadot, the apostolic delegate, and at the New York-based mission support agency headed by Archbishop-designate O'Meara, who fills a vacancy created by the death in October of Archbishop George Biskup.

The Archdiocese of Indianapolis contains 142 parishes and 96 education institutions.
