I question whether the United States government has the right to say it is proud of its record in supporting human rights while it provides help and aid to the British government. The British government, which prides itself on being the "Mother of Parliaments", maintains an oppressive regime in Northern Ireland. This regime, supported by armed British troops, deprives people of their basic legal rights to a trial, to be protected from illegal search and seizure, and to be protected from cruel and unusual punishment. It also deprives them of their basic human rights of equal opportunity for education, employment and decent housing. The basis for this discrimination and deprivation of rights is that people insist upon following the directions of Jesus Christ in the way they believe is correct.

There is ample evidence to support these charges. Recent articles in the New York Times Magazine, the CBS documentary 60 Minutes, and Time magazine show clearly that Catholics are arrested and held for months and even years without a trial, merely on suspicion of having an

association with the Republican Army. Bilish soldiers without search warrants break into homes in their search for weapons. Reported cases of torture used on prisioners confined in the infamous "H-Block" of the Maze prison in Northern Ireland, are numerous. Catholics in the North receive fewer years of schooling. The rate of unemployment for Catholics is significantly higher than for Protestants and Catholics have housing that is lower in quality than that available to Protestants.

The U.S. should not sit back, content with its record until these condition are corrected.
