Cambodia Fund **Tops \$9 Million**

Catholic Relief Services announced last week that it has received more than \$9 million for its Cambodia Emergency Fund, exceeding the \$5 million goal set by the relief agency in November.

Some \$6.5 million of the total came from U.S. Catholic churches in response to the appeal for \$5 million issued by Archbishop. Quinn at the beginning of the holiday season. The rest came from Catholic organizations, individuals and non-Catholics who' sent donations for Cambodia aid.

(The Diocese of Rochester, through its Cambodian Relief Fund, has sent more than \$100,000 to CRS in recent weeks. The local effort is a joint project of the Diocesan Missions Office and the diocesan International Justice and Peace Commission.

(In a prepared statement, Father Joseph Reinhart, chief of the missions office, said last week:
