School Celebrates A Special Dream

The life and work of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was commemorated at Nazareth Academy during an assembly, Wednesday, Jan. 16. The gathering was prepared and presented by the school's Black Student Union under the direction of Ms. Adelita Chirino, moderator,

Guest speaker was Deborah Mullen, candidate for Master of Divinity Degree at Colgate-Rochester Divinity School. In her speech she encouraged the students of the 80s to "revive the dream, retell the story; and reshape the vision" of Dr. King.

"Where is your courage," she challenged. She spoke to the students about the task of transforming the world into a true community. "Move away," she urged, "from independent affluence and lack of concern." She spoke of creating a true "network of caring," which could be attained she emphasized, "by a nation of dreamers and leaders with vision."

The assembly activities

included a recitation of Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech of Aug. 28, 1963, by Michael Council-Atkins. Members of the school's BSU sang "Kumbaya" and response prayers were led by BSU members Nelda Broussard, Robin Council, JoAnn Green and Carolyn Magee.

Dance, song and drama were also a part of the event. Audrey Agee interpreted through dance "Sweet Honey in the Rock". "The Gospel Truth," a tribute to Black women was done as a dramatic reading by Esterillia Williams. Jackie O'Neal sang "We Shall Overcome" and the entire BSU joined in singing "Jesus is My Only Friend."
