# Will Toe the Line — Dutch Bishops

After three weeks of discussion in the Vatican,\* the hierarchy of the Netherlands and Pope John Paul II signed a document affirming conservative church doctrine

It called for priestly celibacy and declared that the laity must not be permitted to perform the functions of priests and become a "parallel clergy."

If carried out, the document would end the Dutch practice whereby married priests are able to say Mass and carry out other sacerdotal functions.

During the discussion, Bishop Albert Descamps, secretary of the Pontifical Biblical Commission, declared that "the proper character of the liturgy and of sacramental piety" must be "safeguarded."
