Goalie, Defense Help a 15-U Kecord

The McQuaid Knights hockey team is 15-0 and currently leading the Monroe County High School League's South Division by 10 points over second-place Penfield.

A very big reason is the overall balance of the Knights. They have five players in the top ten in league scoring. Behind this balanced attack stands the mainstay of their success this year goaltender Jim Herzog.

The 5-9, 198-pound junior has been credited with 12 victories this season and has three shutouts - over Pittsford Sutherland, Aguinas and R-H Roth — and shared a fourth with backup goalie Lloyd Pallum.

His most amazing statistic, though, is his 1.20 goals against average. It was as low as 0.80 until he gave up five goals last week in a 6-5 win over Bishop Kearney.

"I took a lot of ribbing about that one," Herzog said. "Those five goals blow up your average in a hurry.'

But Herzog's average is much more impressive when you consider that the next lowest in the league is the 3.30 shared by Tim Shortsleeve of Sutherland and Joe O'Donnell of Aquinas.

Other than helping the Knights try to win their second consecutive league championship, Herzog has only one goal this season. He'd like to break the goalsagainst mark of 1.15 set last year by another McQuaid goalie, John Taille. Herzog had a good view of Taille last year. He was the backup while his predecessor sparkled.

"It was good for me to sit and watch John," Herzog

One of the things he

learned was to come out more and challenge the shooters. Herzog admits that having a good defense in front of him has helped.

"I only have to make four or five really good saves a game," Herzog said. "I'm getting better at controlling the rebounds, although I had a little trouble against Kearney. I try to deflect the tough shots on my stick side over the boards."
