Boston College Next Stop For Goodberlet

Mike Goodberlet, senior at Cardinal Mooney High School, has accepted an athletic scholarship to Boston College. His sport endeavors while at Mooney have included the tight-end position with the Cardinal football team, running track, and a basketball team member. His expertise on the playing fields and courts has resulted in his being named to the '79 All City-Catholic track team, the '80 All-State Football team, and to the All City-Catholic basketball second team.

Mike is excited about the college adventures being offered him, especially in Boston — a city he thoroughly enjoys — and of course he's anticipating the 1980 football season when he said Boston opens against the University of Pittsburg.

Mike's football career began back when he played in the Vince Lombardi Little League organization, where his father coached, and Mike credits him with the sport knowledge and prowess he's achieved. "He was hardest on me," said Mike of his Dad but agreed that the discipline has enabled him to follow the philosophy to stick with it.

"A lot of kids get discouraged," he said of the players who try out for the high school teams. His advice is for them to stick to it and the discipline needed to overcome the early obstacles will not only teach them to cope with pressure but will provide the stamina to master everything from sports to academics.

Mike is proud to have been awarded the scholarship and that Boston College considers him a future asset to the team but emphasized, "I'm going to school for the education and then to play football."

He was talking about the recent TV programs and articles disclosing the fact that college athletes, with their sights on the pros, finish college without the education. "It's a dream," Mike said about playing pro ball, and when it ends and you don't have anything — that in his estimation is what makes education so important.

In his case, — if in four years the pros do tap him on the shoulders, he indicated he wouldn't turn his back, but that he'd be armed with his degree in Business Management. According to Mike, however, his mother is adamant that before anyone thinks in the pro direction, her son still has to prove himself in the next four years in academics as well as sports.

The Mooney years have been filled for him with the frustrations of defeat and the joys of victory. The one outstanding victorious memory he'll take with him is the Cardinal football team's defeat of the Little Irish in 1978 while he was a junior because, he smiled, "We weren't supposed to beat them."
