Omen Appears . . .

One of the most ominous signs of inflation recognized by the construction industry is the stagnating pace of church construction. A trade publication has said the market is faced with an "increasingly hostile environment" especially in the area of religious, educational and health facility construction. But Religion Today's Beth Spring has sampled attitudes in the major denominations and has found "remarkably little pessimism" over the economic picture, "despite growing concern over the need to retrench with plans for building."

CCD director, from 1929 until 1945, when he became pastor of St. Augustine's.

In 1936-37, Msgr. Duffy toured mission lands, visiting the Philippine Islands, China, Korea, Japan and India, in the company of the late Father Leo C. Mooney, then diocesan director of the Propagation of the Faith society. Msgr. John F. Duffy, his nephew, recalled also that the two priests met Pope Pius XI in Rome. In 1948, on the 25th anniversary of his ordination, Father Duffy was given the rank of Domestic Prelate by Pope Pius XII.

Msgr. Duffy was a member of the Priests' Council for two terms, served as secretary of the Diocesan Building Commission, as Vicar for Religious and as treasurer of the Clergy Relief Society.

His relatives include two sisters, Mrs. Helen Leslie and Miss Lulu F. Duffy, both of Syracuse. Besides the priest nephew, who is pastor of St. Francis, Phelps, there is another nephew, James G. Duffy of Eden; also, one niece, Mrs. Margaret M. Brady of Clarks Summit, Pa.
