In the Air

Stories that are as widely diverse geographically as philosophically focus on the electronics media this week.

Rare Day 15

Easter this year falls on the same day for both the Roman and the Orthodox Churches, and that's a rare occurrence. The calendars of East and West were the subject of bitter controversy for centuries. The East uses the Julian Calendar to reckon the date for the celebration of Easter, while the West uses the Gregorian. But this year, and again in 1984, both great traditions will celebrate the Resurrection at the same time.

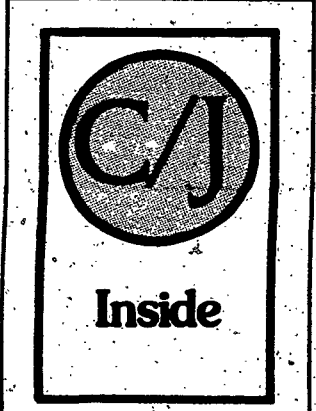
