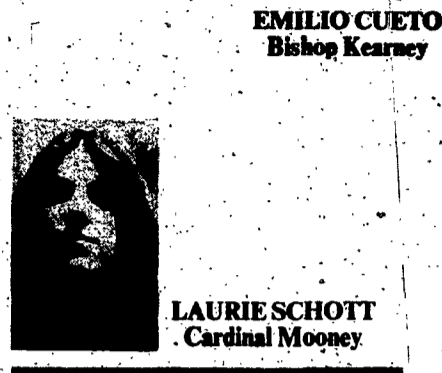

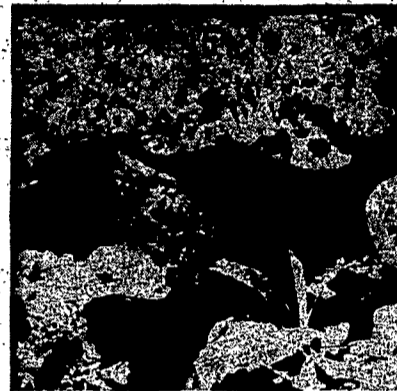

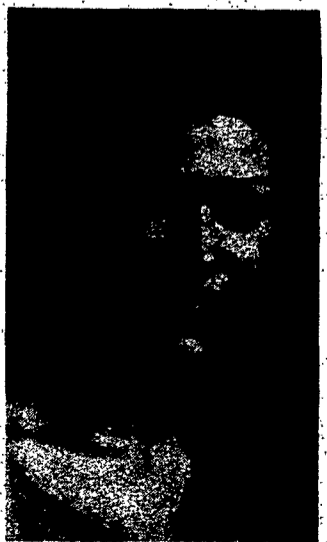
Best Foot Forward
