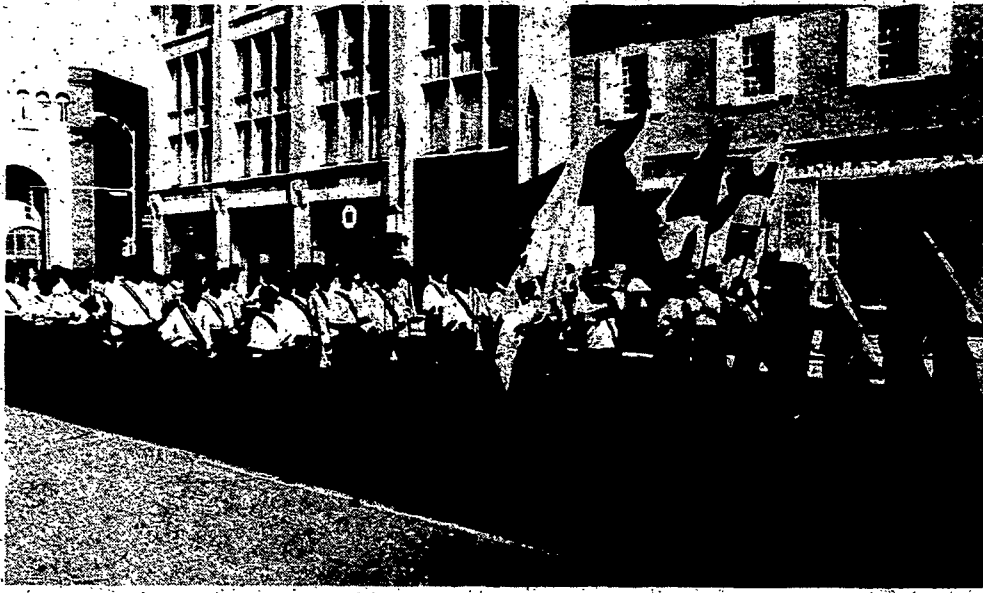

A Voice Over the Radio

RapAround met Denise Barone, a Nazareth Academy junior, at the recent Junior Achievement Midtown Trade Fair. She was manning the WJAR booth, a JA enterprise sponsored by station WPXN-WPXY. She's a bubbly person — talkative, confident — all the ingredients of a radio personality who has logged many hours over WPXY as well as in the newsroom of Channel 8.

Her interest in the Junior Achievement program stemmed from a visit by a JA rep to Nazareth last year. The possibility of doing a radio show was mentioned and Denise indicated her interest. She was contacted for an interview, chosen for a radio show and last September was one of nine JA members who formed the WJAR radio company. Since then, Denise has learned how to sell commercial radio spot ads, keep program logs, write features for broadcasting and also the technical complexities. A friend, Howard Behrens of Fairport, has a control panel in his basement and has taught Denise how to operate the controls.

Denise, WJAR vice president, spends Saturday mornings with the group at the radio station, taping the six two-and-a-half minute segments that are aired over WPXY during the week.

"I was scared and shaking," she said of her first taping assignment. "You know people are hearing you but you don't know what they're thinking." Her statement pointed to the difference between performing to an unseen audience and a live one where you can see and sense their reactions — and Denise has had quite a bit of experience in the live audience performing area. She is a member of Nazareth's Perseian Choir, the Choral Belles, the Lamplighter drama group (she will play Widow Corney in the school's March 14-15 presentations of "Oliver"), and she plays in her parish's (Holy Ghost) folk group.

Her spots on the radio have included entertainment info

shorts, people in the news items that she takes off the station's teletype, and special features including one on Nazareth productions. She is also into the ad selling end of the business with Xerox and Sibley's numbered in her ad commercial sales.

"You have to know what you're talking about," she commented about dealing with the professional advertising world. According to her it is imperative that you project the why and how the buying of an ad will benefit a particular company.

Denise's interests are in performing — drama, music — and though she hasn't decided on a college where she'll pursue these interests, she has been checking out the field.

Regents Think Change

The Board of Regents has approved a tentative proposal which includes several steps to strengthen competence in teaching. The proposal would change the system of licensing teachers, provide State supported in-service training, and new State requirements for local school board review of teacher and administrator performance. The recommendations will be distributed for extensive public hearings and discussions. Final action by the Board is planned for late April.

Some of the requirements include:

— A licensing examination as a condition for entry into the teaching profession.

— An internship of one year's duration would be required of all teachers as a condition for the permanent teaching license.

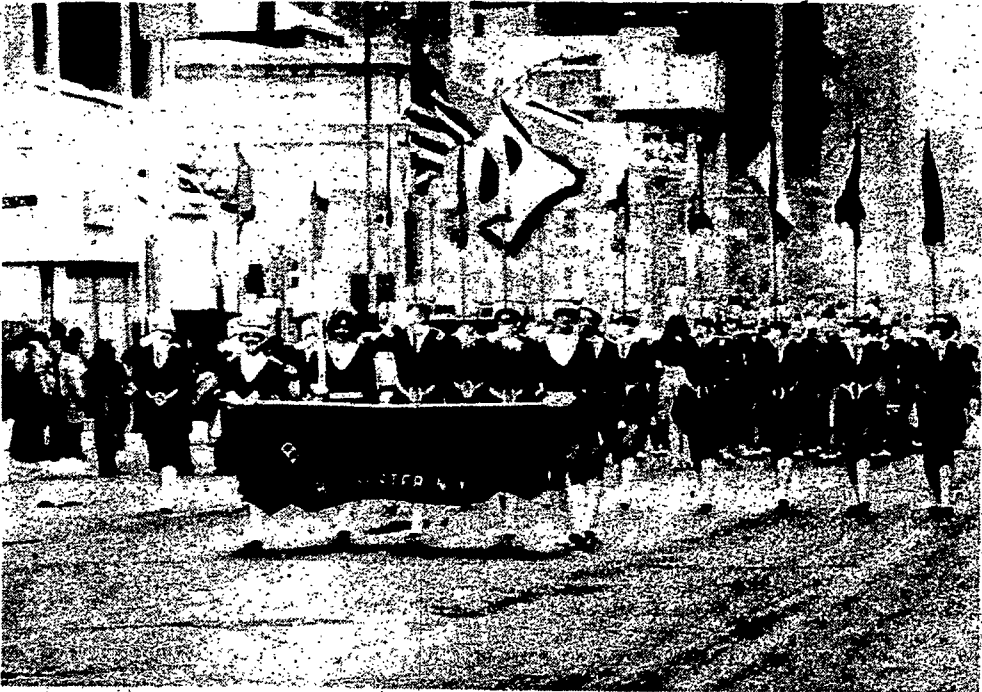
— Each school district would be required to have a system for periodic review of the performance of all teachers, supervisors, and administrators.
