Josephine Zimmer

Josephine Hempel Zimmer, a onetime active clubwoman who reared a priest, two Mercy sisters and three other children, died March 20, 1980, at the age of 82.

The Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated Saturday in St. Monica's Church, where Father Edward A. Zimmer was pastor for most of the past decade.

Mrs. Zimmer, formerly of Rosedale Street, was the widow of Edward L. Zimmer, a past president and chairman of the board of Schantz Associates, a button importing firm. She was a founder of the Cenacle Retreat House, onetime president of the Catholic Women's Club, of the Blessed Sacrament Rosary Society and of the Mercy Mothers' Club, and a past vicepresident of the Aquinas Mothers' Club. She had lived at St. Ann's Home for the past five years.

Her daughters are Sister Mary-Agnes, RSM, principal of St. Mary's School in Bath. Other sons, and daughters-in-law, are Nelson and Ellen, Raymond and Murlyn,

Fr. Dunn Is Citizen of Year

Father Gerald E. Dunn of St. Theodore's really was lionized last week, after cloak-and-dagger maneuvers that preserved the element of surprise.

He was named Outstanding Citizen of the Town of Gates by the Lions Club for his efforts as "originator, founder and motivating force behind Dunn Tower I and Dunn Tower II," the first senior citizens' housing developments in the town.

Father Dunn is a member of the club and of its board of directors, which had to change a bylaw to permit the club to cite one of its own as Outstanding Citizen. Perfect

secrecy surrounded the selection committee's decision, members reported, even though the Gates-Chili News was ready with a page one announcement at meeting time.

Father Dunn has been pastor of St. Theodore's since 1968 and has been very active in community affairs. The idea of Dunn Towers came out of a meeting of leaders of various congregations in 1969. In 1973, Father Dunn turned the first spadeful of earth for the construction of 6.2 acres of land given by his parish. Financed by government agencies, the second tower on the site is nearing completion.
