## Vote with Feet . . . . . 6

The Cuban people, unable to vote in democratic elections, are "voting with the feet," when they flock to the Peruvian embassy seeking freedom, a former political prisoner in Cuba told more than 200 persons at Cornell University. Huber Matos, a military leader in the revolution that placed Fidel Castro in power, soon afterwards was convicted of treason for questioning the places in the military and government given to communists. The improvements in Cuban life that have been made, he pointed out, better enable the government to stay in power. But the people who supported Castro when he came to power, he said, no longer support the government, and one million of them have fled the country.

## Sacraments Aired . . . . 22

The sacramental guideline hearings continued last week as members of the North Region gathered at the Church of the Annunciation to give their opinions on Eucharist, Penance, Confirmation and Marriage preparation. The guideline hearings conclude this week.

## Divine Magisterium . . . 23

The Mission and the Magisterium of the Church are of supernatural, divine origin, Cardinal Luigi Ciappi said recently. Therefore, he asked, "Shall we judge as unjust the contestations . . . and consider ungrounded the claims that mere priests, religious and laity have a Mission and Magisterium equal to those of the sacred hierarchy, and even in opposition to them?" The cardinal was addressing the 10th annual convocation of the Consortium Perfectae Caritatis, a nation-wide group of religious.

## Music in Air . . . . . 18

Two musicals and a Spring concert are in the offing for the public during the next few weeks. On the first two weekends in May, Cardinal Mooney is staging "Fiorello," while "Lit Abner" is the stage production at St. Agnes. The Aquinas Institute Band goes into high gear with a concert, May 14. The times and places are listed in RapAround.

## Haitians Detained . . . . 23

About 8,000 Haitian refugees are "being detained" in Florida, "without sufficient food, shelter or employment," the Office of Black Ministries declared last week. In a statement signed by John S. Walker, executive secretary of the office, a call was issued for equal treatment of Haitians under legislation that affords aid to "Cubans, Indo-Chinese, Cambodians and European Jews and all others wishing to escape repression." The declaration has the support of five other agencies in the community.

## Cenacle Feast . . . . . 23

The Religious Sisters of the Cenacle are planning a major celebration of the feast of Our Lady of the Cenacle May 17. The sisters who staff the Cenacle Center for Spiritual Renewal on East Avenue, and their lay auxiliary group will open the day with Mass. The festivities during the day will include a luncheon and a talk by TV newscaster Margaret Graham-Smith.

## Pilgrimage Set . . . . . 22

The third annual pilgrimage for senior citizens, sponsored by a group of Rochester pastoral assistants, will be held on Friday, May 9. The pilgrimage destination this year is Canandaigua, where travellers will visit the historic foundations of the Sisters of St. Joseph in New York State, and Notre Dame Retreat House.

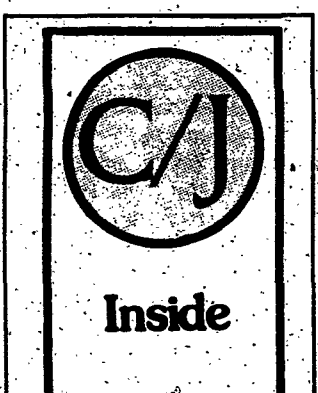

He described St. Edmund's House as a 16th century Catholic foundation which now has graduate students, only, from all over the world, pursuing studies in various disciplines.

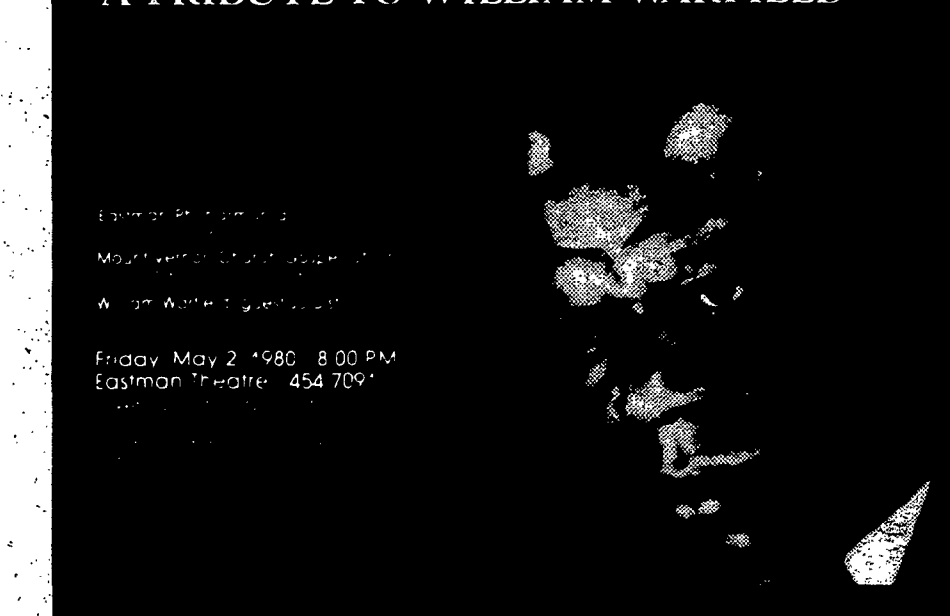
