

13 Priests Note 40 Years Service

Thirteen priests of the diocese are celebrating their 40th anniversary of ordination this month. They are Msgr. John E. Maney, pastor of St. Mary of the Lake in Ontario; Msgr. Charles V. Boyle, pastor of St. Anne's in Rochester; Father Joseph D. Donovan, pastor of St. Mark's in Greece; Father John S. Hayes, pastor of St. Patrick's Church in Aurora and chaplain at Wells College; Father Joseph F. Hogan, pastor of St. Vincent dePaul in Corning; Father Alfred J. Horr, pastor of St. Mary Magdalen's in Wolcott; Father Bernard V. Kuchman, pastor of St. Michael's in Montezuma and St. John's in Port Byron; Father John A. Morgan, pastor of St. Columba's in Caledonia; Father John A. Murphy, pastor of St. Lawrence in Greece; Father Bartholomew J. O'Brien, pastor of St. Mary Our Mother in Horseheads; Msgr. Richard M. Quinn, pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Rochester; Father Albert J. Shamon, pastor of St. Mary's in Waterloo; Father George S. Wood, pastor of Our Mother of Sorrows.

With the exception of Msgr. Maney, who was ordained in Rome on July 30, 1939, the group was ordained on May 18, 1940, by Bishop James E. Kearney.

Though he is considered a member of the class of 1940, Msgr. Maney has requested parishioners to take no special note of his anniversary date.

Msgr. Maney is a native of Geneva, where he attended St. Stephen's School and DeSales High School. After studies at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries in Rochester, the Gregorian University and the North American College in Rome, he was ordained in St. Ignatius Temple by Archbishop (later Cardinal) Aloisius Traglia. Msgr. Maney also took a doctorate in Sacred Theology at St. Mary's of the Lake Seminary, Mundelein, Ill. He taught at St. Andrew's Seminary, served on the diocesan Tribunal, was named vice-chancellor in 1944, was appointed Bishop Kearney's secretary in 1946, was elevated to the rank of papal chamberlain in 1953, and was appointed chancellor of the diocese in 1954. A year later he was named administrator of Corpus Christi Church, a post he held for seven years, when he was named the church's pastor. In 1962, Pope John XXIII named him Protonotary Apostolic. A year later he was appointed vicar general of the diocese. Msgr. Maney, on the advice of his physician, resigned the posts of chancellor and vicar general in 1964. In 1976, he took the post of pastor at St. Mary's.

Msgr. Boyle's celebration will take place on May 18, with a Mass of Thanksgiving at 12:15 p.m. in his parish church. A reception will follow immediately in the School Auditorium.

A native of the Bronx, Msgr. Boyle studied for the priesthood at Kenrick Seminary, Webster Groves, Mo. His first appointment was as assistant pastor at

Immaculate Conception Church in Rochester. He also served as assistant at Our Lady of Good Counsel before being named associate superintendent of schools for the diocese. In 1954, Bishop Kearney appointed him superintendent of schools. Two years later, Father Boyle was elevated to the rank of Domestic Prelate by Pope Pius XII. In 1959, Msgr. Boyle was named pastor of St. John the Evangelist Church on Humboldt Street. He was named pastor of St. Anne's in 1973.

Father Donovan will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, May 18. His parishioners will fete him at a party at Barry's following the Mass.

Father Donovan was educated at Immaculate Conception and St. Monica's schools, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, St. Bonaventure University, where he received his masters degree, and the University of Buffalo, where he took his doctorate in Education. He was first assigned to the Diocese of Paterson, N.J., returning to the diocese in 1941. He has served at St. Ann's in Hornell, St. Margaret Mary in Rochester, St. Patrick's in Corning, St. Peter and Paul in Rochester, Holy Rosary in Rochester. He was named pastor of St. Mark's in 1964. In addition, Father Donovan served as professor of education at Catherine McAuley College of the diocesan Sisters of Mercy.

Father John Hayes will be getting together with the bishop and his own classmates for an observance of the anniversary on May 27.

Father Hayes, prior to his ordination, was schooled at St. Augustine's School, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries. In addition, the Aurora pastor has studied at the Army Chaplains' School at Harvard University, Oxford University and the University of Rochester. He has served as assistant at St. Anthony's, Sacred Heart, St. Augustine's, and Our Lady of Lourdes in Rochester. His chaplaincy with the U.S. Army lasted from 1943 to 1946. From 1953 to 1958 he was also chaplain at the Veteran's Administration in Bath. He was named pastor of St. Patrick's, Elmira, in 1958. On Pentecost, 1966, Bishop Kearney named him rector of Sacred Heart Cathedral, a post he held until 1972, when he took on the dual pastorate of St. Patrick's, in Aurora and St. Michael's in Union Springs.

Father Hogan will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving on Sunday, May 18, at 12:15 p.m. The parish will fete him at a reception that afternoon from 4 to 6 p.m.

Father Hogan attended Waverly High School and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries. He has served as assistant at St. Michael's in Penn Yan and St. Andrew's in Dundee, at St. Patrick's in Elmira, as procurator for St. Bernard's Seminary, as assistant at St. Patrick's in Owego, St. Stephen's in Geneva and as chaplain at Notre Dame High School in Elmira. Father Hogan was ap-

pointed pastor of St. Mary of the Lake in Watkins Glen and St. Benedict's in Odessa in 1961. He was named pastor of St. Vincent dePaul in 1964.

A quiet Mass of Thanksgiving, celebrated on Sunday, May 18, at 10 a.m. will mark Father Horr's observance of his anniversary.

Father Horr's first schooling was at St. Patrick's in Mt. Morris and Mt. Morris High School. His seminary training took place at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's. He has served at St. John's in Spencerport and St. Leo's in Hilton, Holy Family in Auburn, St. Mary's in Corning, and St. Mary's in Elmira prior to being named, in 1965, to the pastorate of St. Mary Magdalen.

Father Kuchman will concelebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at noon on Saturday, May 17, in St. John's, Port Byron. Father Raymond Wahl of Sacred Heart in Auburn will preach. A buffet dinner and social will follow in the Port Byron High School.

Father Kuchman, a graduate of Our Lady of Perpetual Help School, and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries, has served assistant pastorates at Holy Family, St. Andrew's, St. Philip Neri, St. Alphonsus, Auburn; St. Francis Xavier, and Holy Redeemer. From 1948 to 1950, Father Kuchman also served as a chaplain in the U.S. Air Force. In 1964, he was appointed to the dual pastorate of St. Matthias in Atlanta and St. Januarius in Naples. At the latter site he built the present church. Since that time he has served at St. Andrew's in Rochester, and at St. Pius in Van Etten. He was named to his present dual pastorate in 1975.

Father John Morgan will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at 11:30 a.m. with his congregation on May 18.

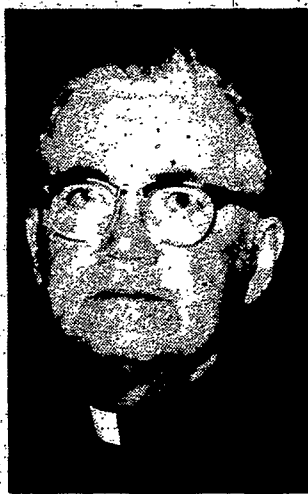
Father Morgan is a native of Auburn, where he attended St. Alphonsus School. He later enrolled at St. Ambrose in Rochester and did his seminary training at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's. He has served as assistant pastor of Blessed Sacrament in Rochester, St. Thomas the Apostle in Irondequoit, as principal of DeSales High School in Geneva, as assistant pastor of Assumption Church in Fairport, and at Our Lady of Lourdes in Elmira, prior to being named pastor of a triple-parish in 1964. That pastorate encompassed St. Bernard's in Scipio Center, St. Hilary in Genoa and St. Isaac Jogues in Fleming. He was made pastor of St. James in Waverly in 1967 and took the Caledonia post in 1978.

Father John Murphy will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at 12:30 p.m. and will be feted by his parishioners at a reception following.

Father Murphy is a native of Geneva, where he attended St. Stephen's School and DeSales High School, prior to entering the seminary. He trained for the

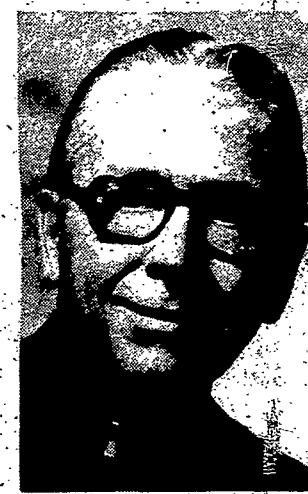

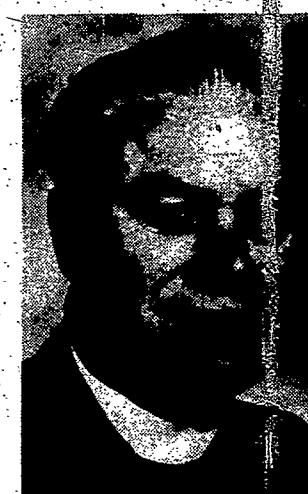

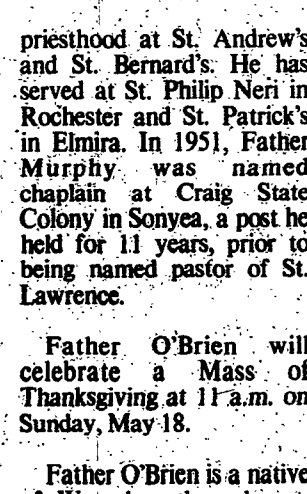

priesthood at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's. He has served at St. Philip Neri in Rochester and St. Patrick's in Elmira. In 1951, Father Murphy was named chaplain at Craig State Colony in Sonyea, a post he held for 11 years, prior to being named pastor of St. Lawrence.

Father O'Brien will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at 11 a.m. on Sunday, May 18.

Father O'Brien is a native of Waverly, where he attended Waverly High School

prior to his training at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries. He has served assistant pastorates at Holy Rosary in Rochester, St. Patrick's in Rochester, Sts. Peter and Paul in Elmira. He was appointed pastor of the last named in 1962, a post he held three years when he was named pastor of the Horseheads parish. In 1967 Father O'Brien was named vicar for the Corning-Elmira-Waverly area. He is widely known as an author. His titles include, "The Heroic Aloysius," and "Spurs to Meditation."
