# Local Group Joins **Amnesty International**

Members of Newman Community, State University College at Brockport, recently "Inter-religious formed an Urgent Action Network Group" of Amnesty International. Their first letterwriting session took place after Sunday morning Mass, May 18.

The group is working on case studies of two El Salvadorean men, Manuel Serrano and Saul Ortiz, which had been sent to the Group by Amnesty International. These men, political activists, were arrested by Government Security Forces on April 23 and subsequently disappeared. There has been no news of their whereabouts and their arrest has not been acknowledged by the Security

"In El Salvador, where Archbishop Oscar Romero was assassinated March 24 for his defense of the poor and the powerless, human rights violations have intensified sharply and it is estimated that some 2,000 people have died in political violence this year," the release said.

Amnesty International, a worldwide movement, works for the release of prisoners of

conscience, the abolition of torture, and for more humanetreatment for all prisoners. The organization only defends the rights of those prisoners who have not used or advocated violence.

The Inter-religious Urgent Action Network Groups are a collection of churches, synagogues and religious communities that work on urgent action campaigns on a monthly basis. Newman Community is one such group. The work is carried on mainly through letter-writing.

Each month members of the Group, composed of people concerned with the protection of people's human

rights throughout the world, come together to write brief. politely-worded letters to government-officials on behalf of prisoners who are at risk: prisoners facing torture, the death penalty, or those in need of immediate medical help. Urgent Action Groups, in a number of regions within the United States, flood the government involved with airmail letters and telegrams, the release said.

"Amnesty International has documented proof that letterwriting has been an effective tool. In 20 years they have secured the release of 13,000 prisoners in 110 countries and have improved the lot of many still in prison."
