U.S. Catholic Award for furthering the cause of women in the church.

In ceremonies here May 6, Father Mark J. Brummel; CMF, the magazine's editor, told Sister Kane. "You forced worldwide attention on the crucial guestion of the rights of women, never letting that question be separated from the fundamental context of justice.
