## Shrine To Be Blessed

A shrine in honor of the soon-to-be-declared-blessed Kateri Tekakwitha will be rededicated at Holy Family Parish in 1 p.m. ceremonies on Sunday, June 8.

The ceremonies will consist of a Mass and blessing of the shrine dedicated to the "Lily of the Mohawks," whose cause for canonization has significantly advanced in Rome this year.

According to Mrs. Jean Bennett, religious education coordinator at the parish, "This is a very special occasion for us because we have had a little shrine in her honor for some 40 years. In those days there was a group of young people called 'The Tekakwitha Club' under the direction of Father Roy Morphy who is deceased but still remembered."

Kateri was declared "venerable" by Pope Pius XI in 1943. Pope John Paul II has recently announced he will declare her "blessed" on June 22 this year.

The shrine is of interest in that it was last year vandalized and is presently

under reconstruction by Rochester artist, Achille Forgiore.

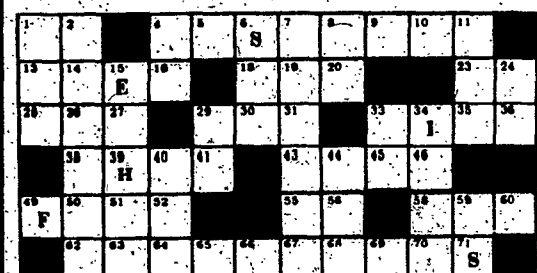
