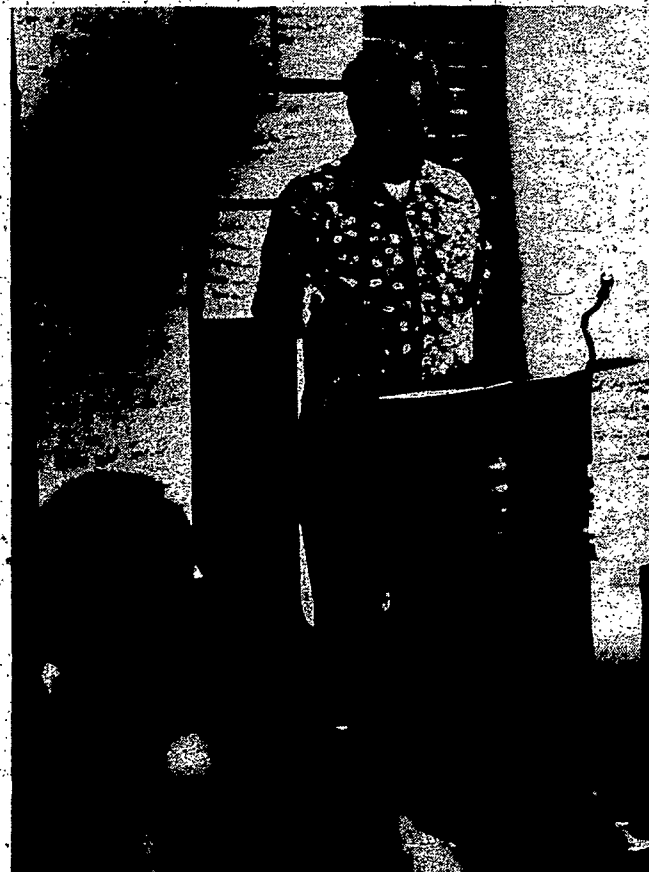




'SALT Talks'

Sister Ann De Ritis To Leave Villa Post

Sister Ann Vincent De Ritis, SSJ, will be leaving the post of executive director of St. Joseph's Villa, this September. She has served at the residential child care agency for 19 years; first as a case worker, then as assistant director from 1966-68, and for the last 12 years as executive director.

Under her leadership, intensification of St. Joseph's residential treatment services and education program has been a priority. The agency has expanded its group and boarding home programs from two homes in 1968 to five homes currently. The campus school program now operates on a 12 month basis to serve residents with severe learning problems. During her tenure of office the legal board of directors was established in 1976.

Sister Ann Vincent, a Rochester native, entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1940. She graduated from Nazareth College and taught in various diocesan elementary schools for 16 years. In 1961 she

received her master's degree in social work from St. Patrick's School of Social Welfare, University of Ottawa.

As a member of the National Conference of Catholic Charities, Sister Ann Vincent served as chairperson for the Conference of Religious and as a vice president of the organization. Currently she is a member of the Jane Gallagher Award

Nominating Committee. She is also on the Board of Directors of the New York State Council of Voluntary Child Care Agencies.

The new director of the Villa will be Sister Judith McKay, who has a graduate degree in social work administration from the University of Michigan and is currently principal of Nazareth Academy.

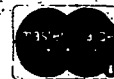

Sr. Josita, SSJ

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated May 30 for Sister Josita Granville, SSJ, who died in the Sisters of St. Joseph Convent Infirmary May 28, 1980, at the age of 80.

The rites were celebrated by Auxiliary Bishop Dennis W. Hickey and Fathers Peter Bayer and Joseph Reinhart.

Sister Josita was born in Ireland and immigrated as a child. After the death of her mother, her father placed her in St. Patrick's Girls' Home in

Rochester. She finished her education there and at Nazareth Academy and then stayed in St. Patrick's to work. In 1919 she entered the congregation from the orphanage.

She taught for 45 years in the schools of the diocese and retired, in failing health, in 1966. She is survived by her brother, John Granville of

Rochester; her sister, Kathryn Mulrooney of Webster; and several nieces and nephews.

The congregation noted on her passing, "She was an excellent teacher. She would never embarrass a child because they found learning difficult, but would quietly ask them to stay for a short time after school and help them understand what was troubling them."

Sr. Theresa, MPF

Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated in Morristown, N.J., on May 27 for Sister Theresa Venanzi, MPF, a member of the Institute of the Religious Teachers Filippini who served in the diocese from 1961 to 1962. Sister Theresa died May 24, 1980.

She entered the institute in 1920 and made her religious oblation in 1922.

Sister Theresa is survived by two brothers, Nicholas of Florida and Anthony of New Jersey; five sisters, Mary Gokey, Christina Salamandra and Edith, all of New Jersey, Catherine Parella of Maine and Lucy Menengus of California; and several nieces and nephews.

Sister Theresa's diocesan assignment was at St. Mary of the Lake in Watkins Glen.
