Tim Barone accounted for the winning run in the bottom of the sixth, scoring from second on Steve Barleben's single.

In the sectional semi-finals, the Cardinals advanced with a 6-1 victory over Eastridge (16-6) behind the three-hit pitching of Jim Walker. Jim Nietopski slammed a two-run triple to highlight a four-run Mooney sixth inning that put the game on ice. Walker struck out six while allowing only five balls to be hit out of the infield.
