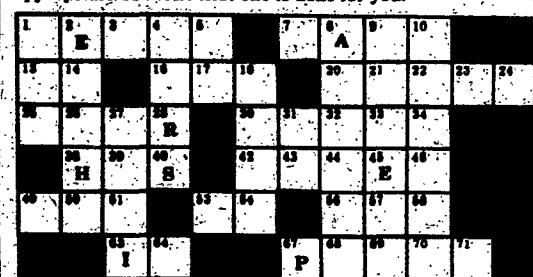


Sunday Scripture Quiz

GEM to Send 10 to South Africa

Genesee Ecumenical Ministries will send ten area church and academic leaders, including John Walker from the diocesan Office of Black Ministries, on a tour of South Africa, at the invitation of Episcopal Bishop Desmond Tutu.

The tour will be financed through a fund-raising campaign launched last week. GEM is attempting to raise \$25,000 before June 21.

The tour is described by GEM as "a mission of understanding and friendship to South Africa. While in South Africa, these concerned citizens will meet with church and community leaders as well as local people to gain insights for dealing with Black-White relations both in Rochester and abroad."

The tour will also include a stop-over in Geneva,

Switzerland, for a briefing at the Programme to Combat Racism of the World Council of Churches.

Synod Bishops To Meet for Consultation

Washington — A "theological consultation and symposium" to prepare for this fall's international Synod of Bishops in Rome will take place June 15-18 at the University of Notre Dame for synod delegates from the United States and Canada.

The delegates will discuss issues concerning marriage and family life with specialists in several fields including members of the Commission on Marriage and Family Life, U.S. Catholic Conference.

The synod itself will begin Sept. 26 and is expected to last a month. Its theme is the role of the Christian family in the modern world. Some 200 Church leaders from around the world will attend.

The synod is a consultative body convened by the pope to advise him on topics of his choosing. The U.S. delegates will be Archbishop John R. Quinn of San Francisco; Archbishop Joseph L. Bernardin of Cincinnati; Archbishop Robert F. Sanchez of Santa Fe, N. Mex., and Auxiliary Bishop J. Francis Stafford of Baltimore, chairman of the USCC Marriage and Family Life Commission.
