In spite of the civil rights legislation 15 years ago blacks feel that racism is still a very serious problem in this country. A Lou Harris poll showed that most blacks feel that white dominated institutions, including the churches, "are either indifferent or hostile to the cause of full equality for blacks."

also served as executive priest of Rochester Marriage Encounter. His other affiliations also include membership on the board of directors of the Cayuga Counseling Center in Auburn, chairmanship of the board of Auburn's CEDAR, membership on the Priests Council, and membership on the Ministerial Review Committee.

Father Metzger's ordination was in 1955. He has served at St. Mary's in Auburn, Christ the King in Irondequoit, St. Anne's in Rochester. From 1968 to 1975, Father Metzger was assigned to St. Bernard's Seminary where, among other duties, he was in charge of apostolic assignments, outside the seminary. He was named pastor of Holy Redeemer in 1975.

Father Teuschel was ordained in 1949. He has served at St. Alphonsus, Auburn; Mother of Sorrows, Rochester; St. Joseph's, Penfield; St. Boniface, Rochester; Immaculate Conception, Ithaca; and Church of the Annunciation in Rochester. In 1969 he was named pastor of St. Joseph's, Rush. Six years later, he was appointed pastor of the Corning church.

Father Davis was ordained in 1945. His parochial work includes service at St. Ambrose, Rochester; Our Lady of

Lourdes, Elmira; Blessed Sacrament, Rochester; St. Ambrose, Rochester; and St. Philip Neri, Rochester. From 1950 to 1969, Father Davis was assigned to St. Bernard's Seminary where he acted, at various times, as librarian, professor of Literature and of Sacred Eloquence. During that period he also served as chaplain to Nazareth Hall Cadet School and as procurator-advocate on the diocesan Marriage Tribunal. He is a past member of the Chemung County General Education Board, the Chemung County Council for the Aging, the Chemung County Office for the Aging, the Elmira and Vicinity Ministerial Association, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Committee and the Lenten Ecumenical Preaching Mission Committee. He was named pastor of St. Mary's in 1978.

The assignments of deacon interns also were announced: Rev. Mr. Paul Thomasso will serve at St. Pius Tenth; Chili; Rev. Mr. Anthony Mugavero, St. Michael's, Newark; Rev. Mr. George Heyman, St. Ambrose, Rochester; Rev. Mr. William Condon, St. Mary's, Scottsville.

Among the priest interns, Father Michael Sullivan will serve at St. Michael's, Newark; Father Michael Schramel, Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Brockport; Father Gary Schummer, St. Boniface, Rochester; and Father Joseph Larrabee, St. Mary's, Dansville.

In two special assignments: Father Daniel Torney returns from study leave at Notre Dame University to take up the associate chaplaincy at Strong Memorial Hospital; Father Timothy McCluskey, a priest intern, will become the administrator of Mt. Carmel Church.
