

Young Cancer Patients Have Camp Opportunity

An unusual program for children suffering from cancer, "Camp Good Times and Special Days," will be available for the first time this summer.

According to a release from the United Cancer Council, the camp is designed for children from 8 to 16 years old whose illness is in remission or under control and who can enjoy such activities as swimming, boating, tennis, softball, soccer, arts and crafts, horseback riding, hiking, movies, songfests and talent shows.

The camp can accommodate about 60 of the estimated 1,000 children suffering from cancer in the Buffalo, Rochester and Syracuse area.

The camp is the first of its kind in the northeast and the fourth such institution in the country. It will be held August 29 to Sept. 4 at Camp Eagle Cove on Fourth Lake in the Adirondacks.

Filippini Religious Celebrate Founder

Last Sunday was a banner day for the Religious Teachers Filippini. Sisters from throughout the east coast gathered in Morristown, N.J., to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the canonization of their founder, St. Lucy Filippini.

Three sisters of the pontifical institute work in Watkins Glen.

According to a release by Sister Renata Amenta, MPE, "Lucy Filippini, a woman of action, a woman of prayer, a woman with a vision, with a dream, left as a legacy to her spiritual daughters, the

Christian education of youth. Her solicitude, care and love for God's people, for His Church, has continued on, spanning a period of more than 300 years. Lucy Filippini longed to bring souls to Christ, to educate them; to free them from the bondage of ignorance and sin; and she achieved this and more, because she loved much."

During her lifetime, St. Lucy established schools throughout Italy, set up CCD classes, conducted retreats for women and ministered to the sick and poor in the area. Sister Renata observed, "Her work among the women was greatly responsible for restoring dignity to the less privileged women of her day, enabling them to achieve freedom of mind and body, so as to take their rightful place in society."

Members of the institute established their first American foundation in 1910. The group now staffs 45

schools and 4 mission centers.

Sister Renata stated that the body of the saint lies incorrupt in a shrine of the Cathedral of Montefiascone, Italy, the site of St. Lucy's first school.

Deaths

Sr. Connolly, RC

Sister Mary Connolly, RC, former superior of the Rochester Cenacle, died June 13, 1980 in Boston, after a lengthy illness. She was 76 years of age.

A native of Boston, Sister Connolly entered the Cenacle congregation in 1933 and

served at the Rochester house for eight years, filling the role of superior from 1953-1960. During that time she oversaw the expansion of the former Todd home next to the planetarium, to accommodate the growing number of adults and children applying for Cenacle programs.

Sister has, since 1974, resided in the infirmary house of the province. She was the sole survivor of her family; her two younger brothers, Jesuit priests, having preceded her in death.
