Synod Opens Sept. 26

Washington — Archbishop John Quinn of San Francisco, president of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops and the United States Catholic Conference, will lead the American delegation to the international Synod of Bishops at the Vatican.

The synod will focus on marriage and family life. The meeting opens Sept. 26 and is expected to last through October.

With Archbishop Quinn, other elected delegates are Archbishop Joseph L. Bernardin of Cincinnati, Archbishop Robert F. Sanchez of Santa Fe, and Auxiliary Bishop J. Francis Stafford of Baltimore, chairman of the USCC Family Life Commission.
