

Opening Week At Bishop Kearney

Bishop Kearney High School will start its 19th school year with a faculty workshop for new teachers, 9 a.m., Sept. 2. Brother Brian M. Walsh, principal, will deliver an address to the total faculty and staff at 4 p.m., followed by Mass at 5 p.m. and dinner at 7 p.m.

Freshmen and sophomores will report to school on Wednesday, Sept. 3, 8:30 a.m.; juniors and seniors will report on Thursday. On Friday, all classes will report

for a test run of the schedule with shortened periods ending at 11:50 a.m. Regular classes begin Monday, Sept. 8.

Students will discover several changes when they return to school. Two faculty members have been appointed to the administration team. Miss Linda D'Onofrio, physical education, will be Dean of Women; Jim Williams, teacher of mechanical drawing, will be the new Dean of Men. Miss Barbara Hurysz will take over duties as director of Public Relations.

New faculty members are: Dan Leonard, a graduate of Notre Dame University; Jim Cala, St. John Fisher; and Gregory Missell, University of Windsor, who will join the

Math department; Timothy Sigris, St. Louis University; Religion; Patricia Jones, Nazareth College; English; Sister Ann Habershaw, Boston College, both departments; Frank Rinere, University of Buffalo; Science; Sister Joselia, College of Notre Dame of Baltimore; Social Studies; Helen Lanzafame from Nazareth College, business subjects; Brother Michael Kabot, Iona College; Spanish; Sister Rita Marie, Villanova University, will serve as guidance counselor.

This year's seniors will have the opportunity to take a computer programming course. They will be able to work at the computer during unscheduled periods for practice and to complete assignments.

ND Begins Next 25

Elimira — Approximately 550 students will begin the 1980-81 school year at Notre Dame High School Sept. 3, according to Sister Mary Walter Hickey, principal.
