schismatic Roman Catholic. bishop in Brazil and was validly ordained to the priesthood and episcopacy by him. After the latter's death, Bishop Ferraz decided to enter the Church of Rome and Pope Pius, after investigation, named him titular bishop of Eleuterna. He was so listed inthe Pontifico Annuario, the Vatican's yearbook, but without the usual background Protestants counter that Mary's place in the Catholic Church is based on bad theology.

Donfried, editor of "Mary in the New Testament," called for a re-examination of Mary's position, noting that "Biblical references must be the starting point" for such a discussion.

Dominican Father Frederick Jelly stated that 'Mary is a place for meeting Christ," citing her value in the Catholic Church which has evolved through tradition. He called for a dialogue to deal with both the Biblical and traditional views of Mary, an idea which Donfried seconded.

Ross MacKenzie, the Presbyterian, noted the difficulty many Protestants have dealing with Mary, which, he said, probably

comes from the time of the Reformation, when Mary was called the "hammer of herefics."

Discussion during the week dealt with the range of issues affecting ecumenism, including both theological points of difference on such things as the Trinity, and such practical issues of Church doctrine and. discipline as the ordination of women. Relations with non-Christian faiths also were discussed

information and no indication that he was a married man.

When Bishop Ferraz flew to Rome for Vatican Council a Brazilian newspaper published a picture of him saying goodbye to his wife and grandchildren. He made a speech on the liturgical decree at the council's first session.

The bishop was 89 and inretirement when he died on May 11, 1969. The Vatican newspaper, L'Osservatore Romano, published the usual front page obituary notice but again without biographical data:

The case of the Brazilian married bishop is believed to be unique, at least in recent centuries. Even the Eastern Orthodox churches, as well as the Eastern branches united to Rome, which permit or-dination of married men to the priesthood, do not elevate: them to the hierarchy.
