# Delegates Leave for Home

The vice president of the United States told them that they represented the epitome of the American spirit of giving: A senator warned them against governmental encroachment in affairs proper to the private sector, a futurist challenged them to stride confidently into a new age, and a bishop prayed with them for parishes to assume responsibility for social ministry.

They delegates to the annual convention of the National Conference of Catholic Charities and the biennial meeting of the Association of Ladies of Charity of the United States. The gathering was held in Rochester, with the diocesan Charities office hosting the event.

The four day event concluded last Tuesday with an address by Vice President Walter Mondale, in town to


promote the campaign of president. Presidential candidate Ronald Reagan had been invited to speak to the group as well, but, according to Maurice Tierney, head of the diocesan Catholic Charities, Reagan declined.

The day before, Sen. Daniel Patrick Moynihan (D-NY) warned the group against the gradual submersion of private organizations which become dependent on big government.

He said that "the national government should assume only those responsibilities that cannot satisfactorily be carried out by the states, and the localities or by the myriad of private structures and organizations."

At stake, the senator said, is the principle of federalism, known in Catholic social justice teachings as the principle of subsidiarity.

As consequence of such submersion, Sen. Moynihan said, is, "Independence is eroded, Autonomy is undermined. Sovereignity is diminished, The actions of the state become more important; the decisions of the state become more determinative. The ability to pursue objectives that the state does not share, in ways cannot sahre, perhaps should not share, is curbed."
