Unusual Class Project To Help Spur Adoption

I.C. Shah had a different idea about teaching and, because he did, many hard-toplace children may find homes.

Shah teaches in the College of Continuing Education at Rochester Institute of Technology and as part of his class on "Effective Selling and Sales Management," members have undertaken a project to raise funds for The CAP. Book. The book, a subsidiary of the Council of Adoptive Parents, is a photograph listing service for children for with special needs who require extra help and exposure to find adoptive families.

The fund drive which began Oct. 6 gives Shah's students the opportunity for direct experience in approaching businesses and restaurants.

Local businesses will be asked to make donations in exchange for publicity in one of the supporting restaurants. Each restaurant will be asked to display promotional material on the tables, en-

restaurant to mention frequently the sponsoring business and the CAP book, and to place a collection cannister on the premises.

Among the first restaurants to participate are Rund's Periwinkle Pub and the Loose Caboose. Businesses which have signed on are Georgetown Liquor and Executone Telephone Systems.

About 40 students are participating and of those 90 per cent not only attend school at night but work fulltime and are community volunteers. They hope to raise \$10,000 for the CAP Book.

 Shah conceived the idea oflearning while performing a community service four years ago. His classes have raised more than \$60,000 for Special Olympics, Epilepsy dation, Association Blind, American Society, Landmark Industries and Volunteers in nership. Shah is an adjunct faculty member of RIT and president of Executone The CAP Book features "A Child Is Waiting" Sundays in the Democrat and Chronicle. Since 1972, 1140 special needs children have been featured and 619 placed with adoptive families. The series previously ran in the Courier-Journal.
