Initiation Sacraments Explored in Workshops

The sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and first Eucharist are intimately linked, Dr. Christiane Brusselmans said last week. And, she noted, the trio of these "Sacraments of Initiation" should be seen first in their significance for adult catechumens before they are applied to children.

Dr. Brusselmans addressed two groups on the "Christian Initiation of Adults/Christian Initiation of Children," in workshops sponsored by the Hogan Center for Continuing Education and the diocesan Office of Religious Education and the Office of Liturgy.

She cited scriptural texts to demonstrate that in the apostolic Church it was the custom to receive into the Christian community adults who had gone through long periods of the catechumenate. "Christian initiation is celebrated in Baptism, Confirmation or Chrismation, and Eucharist. Through these visible actions a person is incorporated into the Church and shares its mission in the world. "Full initiation into the Church occurs by stages. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (Roman) provides a norm for catechetical as well as liturgical practice in this regard. The intimate relationship of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist should be emphásized in the catechesis of both adults and children. Such catechesis will involve many members of the parish community who support and pray with the catechized, besides instructing them so that they may grow in un-derstanding of the Christian message."

The opportunity for liturgical and catechetical renewal which the above paragraphs present, she said, will go a long way in eradicating what she called the "Second Grade Syndrome;' relegating sacramental preparation and reception to grade levels in the parish school.

She explained that when she once worked in a parish in the South Bronx, she discovered a number of older children who had not yet received their first Holy Communion. When she asked them why they had not, the youngsters, many of them immigrants from Puerto Rico, explained that they had not attended school in the United States for their second grade. Thus, any opportunity for reception of first Communion was lost, Dr. Brusselmans


