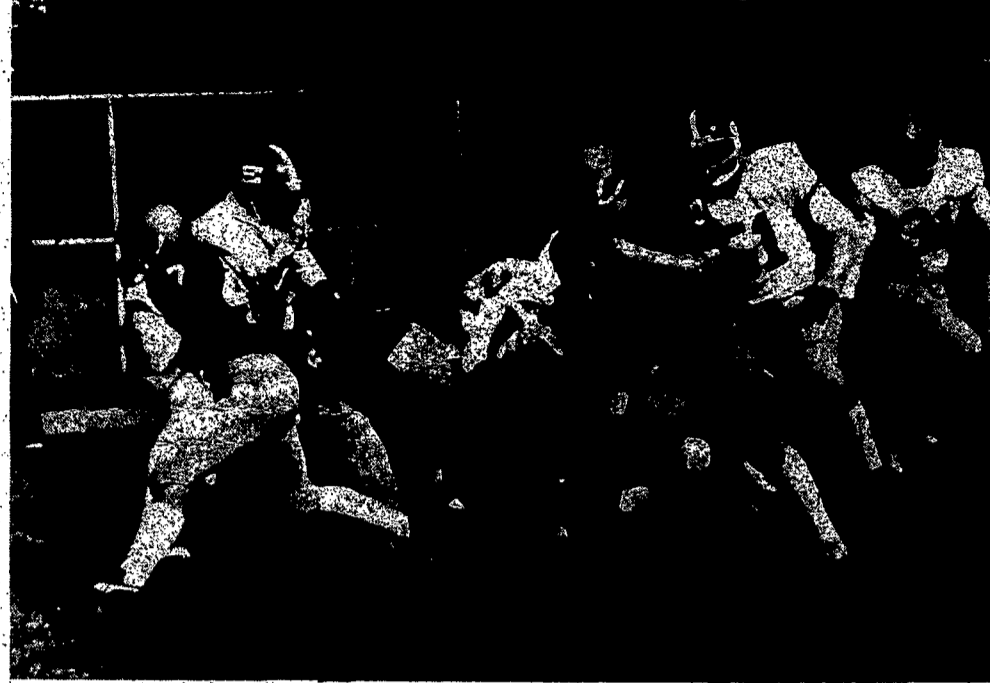
More Merits

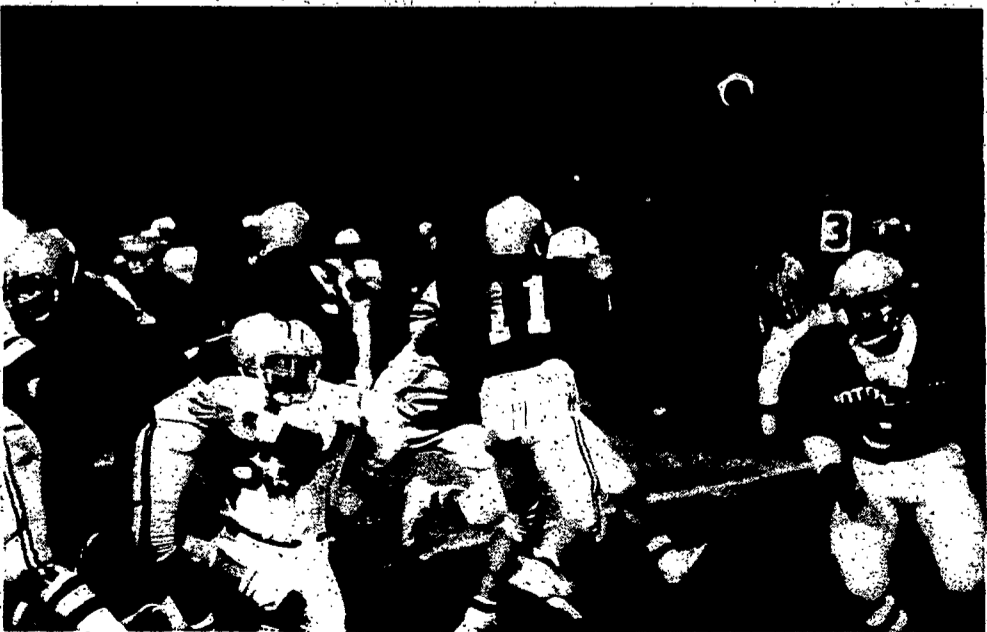
