considered "high risk" because of heredity, prenatal or postnatal complications. The Nov. 18 clinic will offer both extensive screening procedures for children undergoing tests for the first time and more in-depth evaluations for children previously diagnosed as having definite or possible communication problems.

Parents are instructed in exercises and activities for home use if the child shows pre-speech difficulties or lags

in emerging speech. Family pediatricians are notified of the test results if requested by the parents.

Sister Mary Clare Torpey, director of Nazareth's Speech and Hearing Clinic, noted that pre-speech skills develop during the birth to 12-month period and tests help to determine whether those skills are developing properly. Other tests for children from one to three determine whether the skills have actually emerged.

## C.H.D. Collection Set

The Campaign for Human Development (CHD), a national anti-poverty program sponsored by the United States Catholic Conference, is now accepting proposal applications for the 1981 funding year, according to Francine Patella, CHD coordinator for the diocese.

"For ten years the commitment of the Campaign has been to fund local self-help groups that are trying to effectively eliminate the root causes of poverty in their community," Patella said.

Funding of the Campaign is accomplished through the annual Campaign Collection which is taken in November. This year's collection will be taken on Sunday, Nov. 23. Seventy-five percent of the money collected is sent to national CHD headquarters in Washington. The remaining

25 percent remains in the diocese to fund local projects.

To qualify for CHD funds, projects must "demonstrate an innovative and untraditional approach to poverty by effecting institutional change, directly benefit a large number of people, and generate cooperation among and within diverse groups in the interest of a more integrated and mutually understanding society," a CHD release said.
