### Sacramental Guidelines, Special Ministries Topics

Reports from Father Robert Kennedy, on sacramental guidelines, and Father Gerald Appelby, on the status of the Division of Special Ministries, which he heads, were heard at the November diocesan Priests Council meeting.

Council members also heard short reports on priests personnel and parish building amalgamation.

During the morning session, Father Kennedy, diocesan liturgy director, gave a synopsis of the work done so far on updating diocesan sacramental guidelines. Father Kennedy reported that the first draft of the new guidelines has been completed and that work continues on schedule.

He said that the final papers will be sent to Bishop Matthew H. Clark, for his approval, by mid-December. The final papers are expected to be printed and sent to all parishes by February. Bishop Clark then plans to formally in-

troduce the guidelines in a series of meetings throughout the diocese in late February and March, Father Kennedy said. A question and answer period followed.

Father Appelby's presentation initiated a fivepart series of reports, one from each division director, to the council. The council had requested each director to do

Father Appelby briefly described the establishment of the divisions. He said that with Vatican II the Church realized there were social and spiritual needs not being met.

As a consequence, he said, many different ministries were created, causing great confusion. . To provide organization, the five divisions were formed 🚢 Support; Social; Personnel, Staffing and Development; Education and Special.

Father Appelby reported on each of the six departments that make up Special Ministries: Liturgy, Campus

Ministries, Ecumenism, Spanish Apostalate and Dignity/Integrity.

He said that the special ministry division came about because some diocesan departments did not "fit into convenient classifications." He said, however, that all six departments share a common ground in that they are all dealing with new concepts and needs of the Church, and that these needs "require action now.'

Each department is also aimed at "hopefully, eventually" being absorbed into a "parish base," so that individual parishes can perform these duties, Father Appelby

The departments are all making progress, he said, though some are working slower toward their goal than

At the close of the meeting Bishop Clark asked council members to remember Fathers George Wood, Michael Wesley and George Schmitt, who died last week, in their prayers. He also briefly outlined his schedule for the next several weeks, which included attending the meeting of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops. He told members he would report on the conference at the next council meeting in December.



All in the Family



If there is anything good about the bleak days of November it must be the pleasure of coming in from outside to the aroma of a simmering pot of homemade soup or stew.

Homemade chicken soup, corn and clam chowder, yellow split soup, vegetable beef, stracciatella (spinach, grated cheese and beaten eggs dropped in simmering broth) are favorites.

A couple of years ago we added cassoulet, a dish of French origin, to our repertoire. As with the other soups and stews, it is our own version, less elaborate than that given in many. cookbooks.

Cassoulet gets its name from cassolo, the earthernware pot it was traditionally cooked in, and has pork, mutton, garlic sausage, duck or goose along with white beans to make an especially filling stew. With crusty bread, salad, wine, it is a special weekend treat.

#### **OUR VERSION**

Sort and wash I pound of pea beans or navy beans. Place in dutch oven and cover with cold water with small piece of scored salt pork and large onion. Cover and bring to boil.Mean-while, in separate frying pans brown several Italian sausages and chicken thighs (one each per person.) When beans come to boil turn off heat and let sit for one hour. Add meat to beans and resume cooking at low heat poi coverea. Simme until beans are tender and meat is thoroughly cooked: usually a couple of hours.
