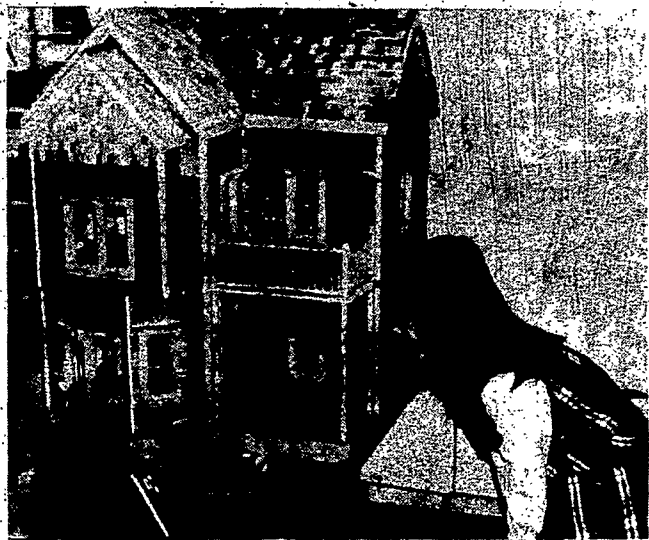

L. Donahue

Auburn — Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated Oct. 29 at Holy Family Church here for Loretta Donahue who died Sunday, Oct. 26, 1980.

A lifelong native of Auburn, Miss Donahue was a retired switchboard operator and receptionist, having worked for more than 43 years for Auburn Trust Co., the predecessor of Marine Midland Bank.

Widely known in both religious and civic communities, Miss Donahue, a communicant at Holy Family, was a member of the Sacred Heart Rosary Society, the Auxiliary of John F. Kennedy division of the Ancient Order of Hibernians (of which she served as first president);

the Ireland Group for the International Festival; the Mercy Hospital Auxiliary; the Mercy Hospital Guild (which she served as president); the Cayuga County Women's Democratic Club; both the national and local American Association of Retired Persons; Auburn Senior Citizens and the 25 Year Club of Marine Midland Bank.

She is survived by a sister, Miss Lillian J. Donahue; four nephews, Dr. John B. Donahue and Dr. Thomas E. Donnelly, both of Auburn, Richard E. Donahue of Attica and Robert E. Donnelly of Apalachin; several cousins, grandnephews; grandnieces, great grandnephews and great grandnieces.

H. Reichart

Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated Oct. 30 at the Chapel of the Motherhouse of the Sisters of Mercy for Helen C. (Klem) Reichart, who died after an illness of several months, on Oct. 27, 1980.

Mrs. Reichart, "Poppy," as she was known to family and friends, was a member of the Klem family who pioneered in this area.

In 1926 she wed Joseph G. Reichart in a unique double wedding in which her brother, Leo, wed Joseph's sister, Leona.

She was active in both civic and religious circles, working for such diverse groups as St. Salome's Parish, the Point Pleasant Volunteer Fire Department (and its Ladies Auxiliary Drill Team), and the Mercy Guild of the Little Flower, which she served as its president.

She is survived by her husband, three daughters, Joan (and son-in-law Eugene F. Erbin of Salt Lake City, Utah), Sister Mary Dominic Reichart, RSM, and Sister Jacquelyn Reichart, RSM; three sisters, Mrs. Sherman (Mabel) Pierce of Conesus, Mrs. Harry B. (Olive) Tuttle of Sarasota, Fla., and Mrs. Arthur (Lillian) Verhey of Newfield, N.J.; two brothers, Leo of Rochester and Earl of San Diego, Calif.; six grandchildren and many nieces and nephews.

"Her faith, her family, people and flowers were guideposts of Poppy's life," her daughter wrote recently. "There is great sorrow over the loss. But there is greater joy in the legacy of love she left in the hearts and lives of all who were touched by this special woman."

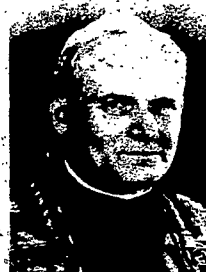
