Earthquake Appeal Shows 'Extraordinary Concern,' Priest Says

"An extraordinary outpouring of concern" for the victims of the Nov. 23 earthquakes in southern Italy has been evidenced across the diocese by contributions totaling more than \$17,150.

The funds, both from parishes and individuals, are being sent to Italian Earthquake Relief Appeal, under the direction of Father Joseph Reinhart, for forwarding to Catholic Relief Services.

Twelve parishes alone have contributed \$13,651.30, Father Reinhart said late last week.

Of those parishes St. Francis of Assisi in Auburn has raised \$8,100.

That parish, under the direction of Father John Nacca, has also forwarded tons of clothing to the relief effort.

The parish breakdown is as follows: Our Lady of Perpetual Help, \$100; St. Andrew, \$378; St. Mark, \$300; Sacred Heart, Auburn, \$588; St. Francis, Auburn, \$8,100; St. Mary, Canandaigua, \$1,900; St. Bridget, East Bloomfield, \$198.15; St. Joseph, West Bloomfield, \$43.05; St. Anthony, Elmira, \$906; Assumption, Fairport, \$400; St. Francis, Geneva, \$200; St. Mary of the Lake, Ontario, \$428.10; St. Mary of the Assumption, Scottsville, \$110; St. Patrick's, Seneca Falls, and the Seneca Falls Council of Churches, \$178.50.

Father Reinhart's totals were made Dec. 19.

He also said last week that the parishioners at St. Francis of Assisi in Auburn were "like St. Lucy, who on receipt of her dowry, gave everything away to help the poor and the homeless." St. Lucy is a special patron of the parish, Father Reinhart said, and the parishioners "certainly follow in her wonderful tradition."

Msgr. William Shaw Auburn Native Priest

Funeral services were held Dec. 14 and 15 for Msgr. William L. Shaw, a priest of the Archdiocese of Detroit and a native of Auburn, at Holy Family Church.

During his 51 years in the priesthood there, Msgr. Shaw served as assistant pastor, assistant chancellor and pastor.

Auxiliary Bishop Dennis W. Hickey presided at the Mass of Christ the High Priest and Bishop Walter J. Schoenherr of Detroit presided at the Mass of Christian Burial.

Msgr. Shaw retired to Auburn in 1968. Until failing health restricted him in the past year, Msgr. Shaw assisted all the parishes in the Auburn area.

The son of the late William and Alice Whalen Shaw was ordained in 1927 in Detroit's St. Peter and Paul Cathedral by Bishop Michael Gallagher.

He is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Charles (Frances) O'Brien and Mrs. Thomas (Mildred) Nugent; a nephew, several nieces, and many grandnephews and grandnieces.
