Earthquake Appeal Shows 'Extraordinary Concern,' Priest Says

"An extraordinary out-pouring of concern" for the victims of the Nov. 23 earth quakes in southern Italy has been evidenced across the diocese by contributions totaling more than \$17,150.

The funds, both from parishes and individuals, are being sent to Italian Earth quake Relief Appeal, under the direction of Father Joseph Reinhart, for forwarding to Catholic Relief Services.

Twelve parishes alone have contributed \$13,651.30, Father Reinhart said late last
