## Rochester Native On Pontifical Institute

Father Walter H. Principe, CSB, a Rochester native, has been named to the International Theological Commission by Pope John Paul II.

Father Principe, a professor at the Pontifical Institute for Medieval Studies since 1963, will serve on the commission for five years.

Father Principe will remain in Toronto, he will meet with the commission in its plenary assembly, at least once a year.

Father Principe, 58, has been a priest for 31 years and has taught at St. Michael's in Toronto since 1949. Aside from his duties at the Pontifical Institute, he also teaches at the University of Toronto
