Sports Who's Who

Greece Arcadia rallied from a 51-39 third-quarter deficit to defeat McQuaid, 72-67, for the Section 5 Class AAA basketball title at the War Memorial.

Incredible shooting from the floor was the big story of the title game. Arcadia sizzled from the field, shooting 12 of 21 in the first half. But McQuaid put those stats to shame, blistering the nets on 19 of 28 first-half shooting (including 11 of 13 in the second quarter).

Arcadia ran off in the fourth quarter, however, outscoring McQuaid 19-2 during one stretch. That turned a 10-point McQuaid lead into an Arcadia victory.

McQuaid's Tom Sheehy was the game's high scorer with 21 points and was also named the tourney's Most Valuable Player. Mike Schmidt led the Titans with 20 points.

Also in double figures for McQuaid were John Thompson and Matt Nesser, scoring 16 and 14 points, respectively.

McQuaid's varsity soccer coach, Bob Armstrong, has resigned after eight years as head coach. No replacement has yet been named.

Bishop Kearney won the team bowling title in the Section 5 Winter Carnival at North Park Lanes by rolling a combined score of 2,873. Paul Tandlmayer led the Kings with a three-game series of 647. Other team members and their scores are: Tom Brush, 635; Frank Fiannaca, 568; Mike O'Connor, 538; and Bohdan Melnyk, 485.

In other Winter Carnival action, Nazareth Academy junior Judie Clawson won her second consecutive Section 5 table tennis singles championship by defeating

Penni Erway of Troupsburg, 21-10, 21-16, 21-14, at Geneseo High JJ School.

Greece Athena upset second-seeded Bishop Kearney, 40-31, in the quarterfinal round of the Section 5 Class A-A girls basketball tournament at Gates-Chili. The 10th-seeded Trojans were led by Marlene List, who scored a game-high 13 points. Mary Joy DelConte led Kearney with 10 points and Julie Aspenleiter added eight.

Ninth-seeded East High rallied in the second half to defeat eighth-seeded Cardinal Mooney, 43-40, in first round sectional action at Hilton. Mary Ellen Heindl led Mooney with 12 points.

Beth Buddenbeck scored 18 points and Mary Joy DelConte added 16 more to lead Bishop Kearney over

Corning West, 53-30, in a first round game at Avon.

The Cardinal Mooney wrestling team marked its first winning season since 1972, finishing with a 12-3 record and capturing the City-Catholic League title along with it.

The squad, under the leadership of first-year coach Rick Lembo, also attained other milestones in the course of the season. These include a record 46 pins in 15 dual meets this year and a very special 42-19 victory over Bishop Kearney, a team Mooney had not beaten in nine years.

Leading wrestlers on the team include sophomores Tom Aancione (22-6-1 overall record) and Al Beany (19-10), juniors Steve Klein (25-4) and Mike Rowntree (17-8), and senior Scott Pavone (23-4).
