More Opinions Advice

To Parents

Editor:

I would like to address a few words to Catholic parents.

Communion Firşt preparation time is beginning again. There are several methods or approaches for teaching First Communion. Some of you will have a newer, more modern First Communion preparation program in your parish.

I belive it is important for parents to understand that perimental approaches to First Communion instruction do not stress the "real presence" of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. These programs are geared more toward the ideas of giving, sharing, celebrating, etc. The emphasis is usually placed on family and community involvement rather than on the "presence" of Jesus in our tabernacles. And so, the children will not necessarily be taught the traditional way we were. Therefore, parents whose children are in these newer, more progressive programs will have to take on added responsibility for seeing that their children receive some instruction on the traditional teaching of the Catholic Church. The real presence with all its beauty and awe will have to be taught in the home. If you want your children to learn little prayers of love and adoration to say in their hearts before and after Communion, you will have to teach them these yourselves. If you feel it is important for them to learn how to talk to

Jesus at Communion time, you, yourselves, will have to teach them how. If you want them to know and be aware of what is happening at the Consecration of the Mass, then you as parents will have to take on this responsibility.

Today we live in an age when in many places deep reverence and respect for the Blessed Sacrament has ceased to be taught and emphasized. It is important that your children learn and preserve in their hearts the beauty and awe of the Blessed Sacrament. the preciousness of God's wondrous gift. Don't deprive your children of the knowledge of these beautiful truths and values of our faith. Teach them at home about the heart of Catholicism - the Blessed Eucharist. For this is Pray what Holy Communion is all about.

Bernard's Seminary is a mistake.

Not in dollars and cents terms is it a mistake because St. Bernard's would probably always need some sort of subsidy from the diocese. But in the unique education experience that St. Bernard's offers there is overriding value that the Catholic Church desperately needs.
