strongly supports the effort and the federally-funded Mutual Assistance Association, made up of resettled Cambodians, will help the refugees adjust to the new culture, with housekeeping guidelines and in finding reading material.

Mrs. Humaydan stressed

that sponsors incur no financial obligation — "\$300 per immigrant is provided to help with resettlement."

More than 100 Vietnamese and Laotian families have been resettled here, she said. Mrs. Humaydan further stressed that parishes should call her at Catholic Family Center "if only considering

sponsorship. Even those who may not make a firm commitment should call, if only for information."

The State Department chose the 10 cities for resettlement, using three considerations — available housing, open employment markets and already existing refugee committees.

## 7 Seminaries To Be Considered

Bishop Matthew H. Clark has announced the seven seminaries that will be considered for theological studies and priestly formation of Rochester seminarians. They are:

American College, Louvain, Belgium.

Christ the King Seminary, East Aurora.

Immaculate Conception Seminary, Darlington, N.J.

North American College, Rome, Italy.

Seminary of the Im-

maculate Conception, Huntington, N.Y.

St. Mary's Seminary, Baltimore, Md.

Theological College at Catholic University, Washington, D.C.

The announcement follows the bishop's January decision to end the program of priestly

formation at St. Bernard's Seminary at the end of this academic year. A committee convened by Father Thomas J. Valenti, diocesan director of vocations, has reviewed and recommended the seminaries listed by the bishop. Also serving on the committee was Father Frank Lioi, rector, and two faculty members and two Rochester seminarians from St. Bernard's.

## Two Priests Leaving Posts

The Pastoral Office has announced that Father Robert J. Kennedy, diocesan director of liturgy, and Father Lewis Brown, diocesan director of religious education, will be assuming new diocesan responsibilities in June.

No successors have yet been named by Bishop Matthew H. Clark.

Father Kennedy was named to the Office of Liturgy in 1975. Before that, he served at St. Mary's in Canandaigua and St. Margaret Mary's in Rochester.

Father Brown was associate pastor of Assumption, Fairport; St. Alphonsus, Auburn, and St. Ann's, Hornell, before joining the Religious Education Department.

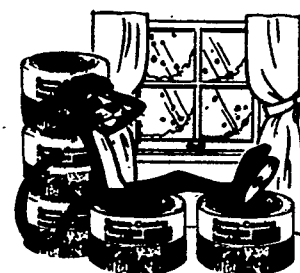
### HOLY HOUR

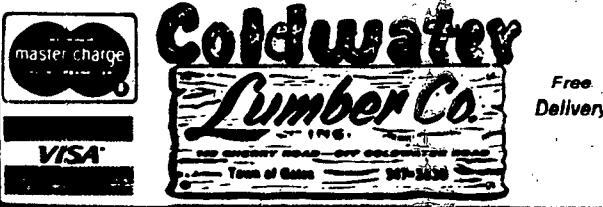

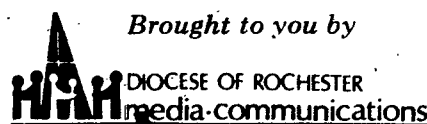
