Women Learn About Themselves

An in-school workshop on sexuality was held for St. Agnes freshmen on March 17. The seminar was a supplement to the sex education which is provided in the curriculum by the theology department.

Nurses conducting the workshop were Karen Eichelberger and Marie Riga Zielger, instructors at the University of Rochester School of Nursing; and Cynthia Bayer and Chris Kogut of the Rochester Adolescent Maternity Program, RAMP.

According to Sister Sheila Briody, chaplain and coordinator of the program, "the nurses were here to give facts... the physical and emotional aspects related to sexuality that the nurses deal with are further discussed in the context of Christian faith in our theology classes."

Topics dealt with during the workshop were: anatomy and physiology, feminine hygiene, and influences on sexual decision-making. The theology courses relating to these topics are: the person, family, and community course for freshmen; morality class for juniors; and the marriage course for seniors. Sophomores take health, with sex education a component of that course.
