To clarify the salvation question raised in recent articles in the Courier-Journal, would you please state in your column the teaching of the Roman Catholic Church concerning how a person gains eternal life or is "saved?"

I would appreciate specifics, including the Church's reasons for its position, whether scriptural, traditional or otherwise.

Dear AG,

I cannot, of course, present in several hundred words the whole doctrine of salvation, but these are the basic statements (with some references):

1. From our origins, the human race has been cutting itself off from God by sin. Pride and selfishness were imbedded in human nature. Rom. 8:5-13.

2. God's love is unwavering. He always has and always will wish to share His life with us. God's actions toward bringing us back to Himself is called salvation history. (Through the Old Testament to Jesus and from Jesus until now.) Rom. 8:28.

3. Sin, individual and social, had become deep and rampant when Jesus Christ, Son of God, came to overcome the power of sin and fill us with His saving power and presence. John 10:10; Mt. 20:28.

4. Jesus opened himself totally to the Father, responded perfectly to His will and so broke the barriers of sin and death. John 5:30; Phil. 2:5-11.

5. Jesus saved us by His death and resurrection. Rom. 5:25. By dying Jesus made up for our sins. Rom 6:4-11. By rising to new life, Jesus obtained for us an

K of C 229 Opens Vocations Fund

Elmira — Council 229, Knights of Columbus, has announced the establishment of a Vocations Fund to assist local candidates for the priesthood.

Clifford Benedict, who proposed the project to the council, explained that they are now seeking donations to the fund so they will be able to assist seminarians who need financial support.

The project came about following a request by a local seminarian for assistance with traveling expenses, Benedict said. The council is increasing the cost of its newsletter sponsorships as part of the

project, with the proceeds being placed in the Vocations Fund. The council may consider other fund-raising projects in the future, he added.

When the fund is large enough to begin disbursements, Benedict expects that it will act upon application of seminarians, and be allocated based on their financial need.

adoptive sonship of God. Rom. 8:15-17.

6. We must accept Christ as Saviour by humbly, obediently, unselfishly, lovingly accepting His will which is the will of the Father. Heb. 9:11-15; Phil. 2:5-11.

7. This acceptance, itself prompted and made possible by God's grace (gift), is necessary for each of us in proportion to our lights and opportunity. Jn. 15:5-17.

8. By this acceptance, we enter into Christ's "everlasting covenant." We pledge ourselves to love, His kind of love. Lk. 22:20; Jn. 15:12.

9. We receive this power by coming into contact with Jesus through Sacraments, Scripture, prayer and other people. Rom. 8:26-27.

10. It is also the constant teaching of the Church that God wills the salvation of all people, and so even those who have never heard of Christ nor come into contact with Him in a meaningful way will be saved through His saving power in ways known only to God. Rom. 11:32.

There is much more which we cannot write here.
