Kodak Scholars Honor Parents and High Schools

Three seniors from Rochester Catholic high schools will receive 1981 Eastman Kodak Company Merit Scholarship awards.

The scholars are Maria R. Clement, Bishop Kearney; Karen R. McCloskey, Nazareth Academy; and Evelio D. Perez-Albuera, McQuaid.

They are among 34 high school seniors, sons and daughters of Kodak people throughout the U.S., who have earned awards ranging from \$500 to \$3,000 annually. This is the largest group of seniors to receive these Kodak awards.

Maria, daughter of S. Thomas and Rita Clement, 604 Van Alstyne Road, Webster, plans a business management career. She chose to enter Clarkson College a year early under an accelerated program, and will enroll in the University of Pennsylvania this fall to study business administration.

Maria was active in Junior Achievement at BK and has worked as a volunteer at a YMCA day camp.

She is interested in skiing, swimming, water skiing, bicycling and travel. Her father is in an equipment

Karen, Nazareth Academy, is considering a career in government service, perhaps with the diplomatic corps. These winners will be presented at gatherings honoring the academic achievements of Eastman Company Merit Scholarship award recipients. James S. Bruce, senior vice president, corporation relations, will host a luncheon on Tuesday, April 28, at the Kodak Marketing Education Center for the recipients and their parents.

The scholarships are renewable and provide each recipient with funds for four years of full-time study or until completion of a bachelor's degree, whichever comes first. The Kodak merit scholarship program is administered in cooperation with the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. Through NMSC, Kodak currently is supporting 87 scholars on 57 campuses across the nation.

Finalists qualify on the basis of test scores, academic records, leadership, extracurricular accomplishments and other standard NMSC requirements.
