BASEBALL — Jim Nietopski had three hits and two runs batted in and Rich Razzante also drove in two runs as Cardinal Mooney bombed East Rochester, 12-0, in a non-league game at E.R.

Bishop Kearney swept a doubleheader from visiting Eastridge, 6-4 and 16-14. In the first game, pitcher Ron Nazzaro went the distance and Tim Mull slugged a three-run double. In the second game, the Kings rallied for seven runs in the last inning to pull out the win. Frank Fiannacca homered and John Sheridan was the winning pitcher.

Tony Alomar blasted a two-run homer in the third inning and finished with three runs batted in as Aquinas beat host Gates-Chili, 13-9.

McQuaid's Peter Palermo had one whale of a week. First, Palermo pitched a one-hitter and fanned 14 men en

route to a 3-0 win over Jefferson. Then, he slugged a grand slam home run in the fifth inning to lead the Knights past Brighton, 10-2. Finally, Palermo gave up only two hits and struck out 10 as McQuaid crushed East High, 12-0.

Aquinas thumped Honeoye Falls-Lima, 11-3, as Tony Alomar ripped a two-run homer and John DiNardo added a bases-loaded triple.

McQuaid's 400-meter relay team of Paul Price, Jim Jenkins, Frank Saper and Mark Palvino finished third in the seventh annual Rutgers Relays in New Brunswick, N.J. Other high finishes for the Knights were the 1,600 relay team of Jed Hanna, Saper, Price and Jenkins, that finished fourth; and a fifth-place finish by the 3,200 relay team of Tom Ward, Joe Pronessa, Hanna and Saper.

Aquinas won the high jump relay and finished third in the 3,200-meter relay in the Early Bird Relays at Sweet Home in Buffalo. Pat Kane, Chris Schiano and Tom Loewenguth combined to win the high jump. Glen Fetterly, Lou DiFabio, Kevin O'Sullivan and Steve Winter placed in the 3,200.

The McQuaid track team won the A Division for the second time in three years in the fifth annual Elmira Invitational track championships. Dan Geen won the discus and was second in the shot put to share the award for outstanding athlete in field events with Jim Nichols of Elmira Notre Dame. Nichols won the shot and was runner-up in the discus to Geen. Tom Warth of McQuaid won the two-mile event.

Tom Sheehey, McQuaid's six-foot-seven sophomore center, has been named to
