
Father Joseph J. Moffatt, CSB, Aquinas Institute principal, has announced the appointment of two Aquinas alumni to the school staff.

Continued from Page 1 Department and Secretary of State Alexander Haig, saying that the U.S. had known for several days the identities of those arrested in the December murder of Sisters Ita Ford, Maureen Clarke and Dorothy Kazel and Jean Donovan.

Speaking earlier in San Francisco, White described Secretary of State Haig's view of the murders as "cheap" and "unjustifiable." Haig had intimated that the four women were subversive agents in El Salvador.
